Starting Fall 2011, all continuing WPU students in the current GE program can satisfy a GE requirement with an equivalent UCC (or Core) course from the same discipline.

Notes:

- All courses at WPU now follow a 4-digit code; e.g. ARTH 1010
- Courses in BANNER will appear with one of the following attributes. Check this attribute before registering.
  - o "General Education Requirement"
  - "UCC-Area" (e.g., "UCC-Expression-Literature")
